## First Day of School

The first day of school this year is going to be very different. The actual first day of school on Wednesday is a fully remote half day. All classes will be conducted online.

The first hybrid day of school on Thursday will take critical planning. Please be sure to check your emails from teachers who will be telling you which teacher your child is assigned to. When you bring them to school they will go in their assigned door by grade level. Students should then walk directly to their assigned classes. We will have staff at the doorways to answer any questions and teachers will be in the hallways offering guidance. Here are the entry doors and room numbers by teacher:

## **Playground Structure**

We must insist at the beginning of the school year that students stay off the playground structure. The custodians have a very busy schedule as they will be cleaning restrooms, Kindergarten classrooms between sessions, classrooms used for lunchrooms and desks in the special education department between groups of students. If we were to use the play structure it would have to be wiped down between uses. So until we are used to a cleaning schedule we will not be using the play structure during school time.

Please remember that this is public property so if you would like your child to use the structure after school or weekends you can always let them if you are supervising.

## **Bathrooms**

We realize that bathroom use is a concern for many parents and us as well. Teachers will be taking their classes to the bathroom at designated times. The rule will be one in one out. If we see that this can't be managed properly we will institute a bathroom pass system where students will leave their pass outside the bathroom to indicate it is occupied.
